Remembering Justin

This special issue of broadcast is dedicated in memory of our friend and Founding Board Chair, Justin Vigdor.

A true visionary, Justin encouraged others in the community to explore new ways of thinking about collaboration, accessibility, and providing opportunities for people with special needs and their families.

In 1962, Justin led a group of parents and providers who challenged common assumptions of the era about the abilities of people with disabilities and special needs and the lack of community inclusion. Their goal: to bring together many different nonprofits scattered across the community under one roof, featuring a fully-accessible floor plan, the first of its kind, with spaces adaptable to the unique needs of each agency, as well as shared spaces open to all.

While each agency would remain independent, their collaboration would help build capacity, create operational efficiency, steward community resources, and help raise awareness. In 1968, the doors opened to our flagship location on Elmwood Avenue, known today as our Golisano Campus.

With his tremendous legal understanding and tireless energy, Justin created a framework resilient enough to accommodate as our collaborative grew from serving 3,000 people each year to serving over 55,000 children and adults and their families on six campuses annually during his lifetime.

Justin's deep empathy helped ensure our innovative model would not only grow over time, but also provide the flexibility for our agencies to be able to adapt and respond to meet the most urgent community needs.

A pioneer, a self-proclaimed renegade, an advocate, counsel, donor, and volunteer like no other -- Justin will be greatly missed, yet his legacy will continue to inspire us. •

In 2021, I had the honor of joining Justin and another early volunteer, John Horvath, for a StoryCorps recording—now archived at the Library of Congress—about Al Sigl's history and the power of partnership. During that conversation, I reflected on how our collaborative has always been about more than just a building. It is about relationships—friendships forged over decades of working together to make our community stronger and more inclusive.

As Justin would attest, making this dream a reality took years of dedication. Collaboration is hard. Even under the best circumstances, moving forward requires flexibility, grit, and grace. Yet Justin made it look easy. Because of the example he set every day, people wanted to be part of Al Sigl's success.

As a nonprofit leader and in my own life, I have been blessed to learn from Justin's example. He always did the right thing, no matter how difficult or unrecognized. His selflessness was unparalleled, reflected in the company he kept and the values he lived by.

Justin's legacy continues to inspire us, reminding us that true impact is not measured in structures but in the lives we touch and the partnerships we build.


